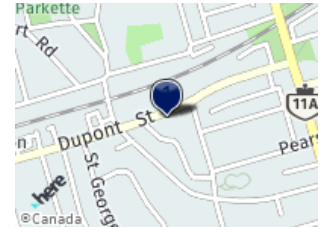

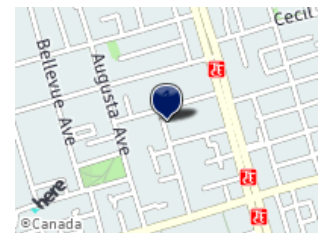

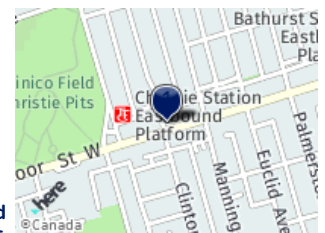

### Tacos El Asador

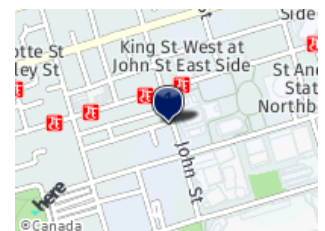
"Delicious Tacos, Hot Salsa"

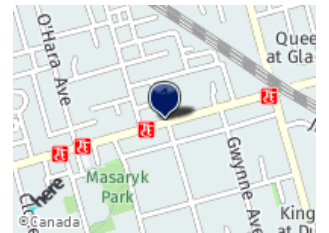
