The Biblioteca Museo Teatrale SIAE stands as a treasure trove of theatrical history and culture. The collection in this small 15th-century palazzo offers broad documentation of the world of theater. Enthusiasts will find prints dating back to the 16th Century, playbills, old scripts, costumes, portraits, oriental puppets, masks, and props used by great actors. The library contains roughly 50,000 books and writings on the theatrical world and a complete photographic archive. It also hosts exhibitions, lectures, and cultural events that celebrate the artistry and innovation of Italian theater.







Villa Medici

"School of the Greatest"

In the 16th Century, Villa Medici was built on the Pincio hill, and was named "Medici" when Cardinal Ferdinando de' Medici acquired it from the Ricci da Montepulciano family. The exterior walls of the villa are decorated with Roman statues and bas-reliefs, as if to create an open-air museum, a style which was much in fashion at that time. This was possible then because during the construction of large residences, archaeological remains were inevitably found during excavations for the foundations, and so these discoveries were more chance findings than systematic digs. The villa is the seat of the French Academy in Rome.







Galleria Nazionale d'Arte Moderna

"Mainstay of Contemporary Art"

The collection housed in this Neo-classical building includes works from the 19th and 20th Centuries. The 19th-century works are mostly those of the Macchiaioli (Florentine impressionist painters), a movement similar to puntinismo (pointillism), a style based on the use of spots of color to create paintings whose subjects were distinguishable only from a certain distance. Among the 20th-century artists represented here are De Chirico, Carrà, Sironi, Casorati, and Marini. The museum often organizes temporary exhibitions and has its own restaurant, Caffè delle Arti.



Museum of Contemporary Art of Rome

"Enjoy Modern Art"

Museo d'arte Contemporanea Roma or MACRO, as it's commonly known, is a modern art museum that offers a permanent collection of some of the most thought-provoking, expressive works in the Italian art scene since the 1960s. The Museum was founded in 1999 by converting old plants of Peroni beer. The new museum building has a large terrace of 2,500 square meters (26,909.78 square feet), parking for 161 cars and various museum services. With its main site here and an annexe, MACRO Future, in what used to be a slaughterhouse, the Museum of Contemporary Art in Rome attracts locals and tourists with its fecundity of imagination and the modern nature of the designs.
