

It is located in the central district of El Raval, which has seen a significant cultural resurgence in recent years, showcasing distinctive architecture and lending a lively spirit to the area surrounding this attraction. The museum first opened to the public in 1935 for an exhibition of Fortuny's oil painting 'The Print Collector.'
