



The museum at the villa takes visitors back in time and lets them explore the beautiful architecture, European furnishings and other details of its past. Over the years, this stately villa has appeared as a backdrop for several Hollywood movies and soap operas, including Ace Ventura: Pet Detective, Iron Man 3, and Days of Our Lives.



"National Training Orchestra"



"World of Art"



The Barnacle Historic State Park


"Historic Miami Home"

Unlike many of South Florida's state parks, Barnacle State Historic Park is centrally located and easily accessible by automobile. Just off the main street in trendy Coconut Grove, this five-acre (2.02-hectare) historic site offers visitors a glimpse into a past full of beauty and luxury. This stately structure was originally the home of Ralph Middleton Munroe, a landowner and yacht enthusiast who hailed from New York. Before and after Munroe's passing, measures were taken to ensure that the property reflected South Florida's culture and blossoming heritage. Guests can tour Munroe's home or explore the lush land outside. The park also offers ample amenities for wildlife watching and picnicking.

Cape Florida Lighthouse

"Old Lighthouse in the Area"

Built in 1825, this 95-foot (28.95-meter) lighthouse is one of the oldest buildings in south Florida. It originally guided sailors through the dangerous waters along the Straits of Florida. Although it was removed from service several times during various wars, it has weathered the years extraordinarily well. The lighthouse is part of Bill Baggs Cape Florida State Park. Guests can take guided or self-guided tours or explore the lighthouse. The Cape Florida Lighthouse makes for a historic and natural treasure, offering a blend of maritime history, scenic beauty, and outdoor recreation.





The Ancient Spanish Monastery

"Beauty of the Ages"

Spanish Monastery was originally constructed in 1141 in Segovia, Spain and brought to America in pieces by William Randolph Hearst to be rebuilt stone by stone. It is the oldest building in the western hemisphere. Now officially named the Ancient Monastery St. Bernard de Clairvaux, the building serves as an historical landmark, an Episcopal church with 200 active members and a tourist attraction. The building is available for weddings, receptions and parties.



Coral Castle

"Mythical Landmark"

For years this phenomenal work of art has fascinated people from all over the world. Coral Castle's creator carved his fantasy world out of stone using nothing but homemade tools. Latvian-American sculptor Edward Leedskalnin took more than two decades to create the Coral Castle. The castle is believed to be made out of coral, however, it is carved out of oolite limestone and there was no mortar used. The castle complex comprises a sundial, a polar telescope, furniture, etc. A major tourist attraction, this landmark is an example of the strenuous efforts of Leedskalnin.



Everglades National Park

"Stunning Subtropical Wilderness"

Home to a seemingly endless labyrinth of subtropical wetlands, Everglades National Park shelters a peculiar ecosystem within its enormous expanse. Stretches of the park's lush swampland feature a network of mangroves and a robust breeding ground and habitat for an array of wading birds and varied wildlife. Its dark, tropical depths are shrouded in grassy rivers and dense marshes that are home to the famed American alligator, West Indian manatee, hundreds of aviary species, and the elusive Florida Panther. Tropical hardwood hammocks form ideal shelters for reptiles, while wet prairies with their brackish water support the growth of succulent plants like glassworts. While modern concerns like global warming and surging sea levels loom as considerable threats to the park's fragile ecosystem, the Everglades continue to be a constant source of beauty and wonder for all who visit.
