"Alive with History"

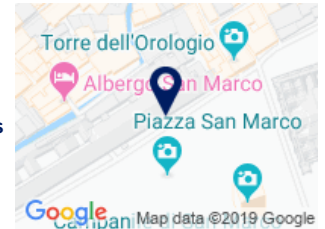

"Historic Café"

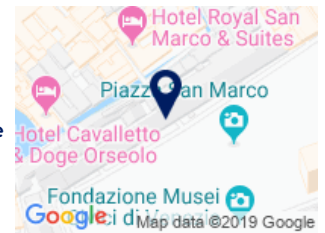

"Historic Café in Piazza San Marco"

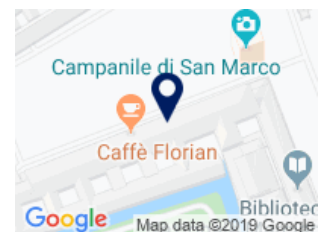
