
The McKittrick Hotel





This 100-year old building is the oldest theater on Broadway, and is considered one of the most beautiful. Built in 1903, its soaring columns and penthouse windows are magnificent. With a seating capacity for 925 people, it is relatively smaller than the other Broadway theaters. However, it has hosted some of the greatest artists from around the globe. Paul Osborn, Whoopi Goldberg and Marc Salem are just a few who have performed here. Past productions include I Am My Own Wife and The Invention Of Love. Watch out for Live From Lincoln Center, a program that has famous orchestras and artistes performing. Lincoln Center holds about 400 live performances a year, ranging from classical to modern productions. And as if that wasn't enough, the Center also hosts many events put on by the Film Society at Lincoln Center. There are guided tours on a daily basis that explore the world-renowned Metropolitan Opera House, Avery Fisher Hall, the New York State Theater (home of the New York City Opera) and the Vivian Beaumont Theater. During the tour, your guides will entertain you with fascinating stories and give you a glimpse of a rehearsal in progress.



Beacon Theatre

Among the highlights on Upper Broadway stands the magnificent Beacon Theatre. Opened in 1929, the theater was designed by Walter W. Ahlschlager as a prime motion picture venue and still attracts crowds with its schedule of live music and entertainment. The opulence of the theater is credited to the Neo Grecian design of its stage, white marble carpeting on its floors, and eastern mysticism depicted on murals that drape its corridors. The theater has played host to the biggest names of the entertainment industry, even hosting the Tony Awards on several occasions. So for a bit of the old glory while in New York, catch a gig at The Beacon Theater.




