Invernaderos Reales de Laeken

"Los Invernaderos Reales de la Monarquía Belga"

Construido por el rey Leopoldo en 1873, estos brillantes domos de hierro y cristal rodean el Palacio Real de Laeken. Los invernaderos eran construcciones novedosas en esa época y estos son particularmente imponentes debido a su diseño Art Nouveau. Los invernaderos son el hogar de un sinfín de plantas y flores únicas. 

Botanical Garden of Brussels

"National Botanic Garden of Belgium"

Located in the northern edge of the city, the Botanical Garden of Brussels is a pretty garden that hosts a variety of plants. In 1938, most of the botanicals were moved to the National Botanic Garden, but this urban park still remains a beautiful spot to rest or take a stroll amongst the large trees. The garden still houses 30 of the 52 bronze sculptures that were a part of the park in the 19th Century. Besides the sculptures and fountains,



the garden feature a gazebo at its center and has a collection of herbs, carnivorous species and rare and exotic specimens of plants.

Groot-Bijgaarden Castle

"Historic Castle"

Built in the 12 Century, Groot-Bijgaarden Castle has a beautiful Flemish Renaissance style with pink bricks and a slate roof. Cross the impressive moat on a five-arch bridge and admire the castle's heavy fortification. As you explore this historic site, take a moment to explore the 30 meter (98 feet) high tower that was built around 1347 and was the castle's dungeon, complete with 2 meter (6.5) thick walls.


