Space Shuttle Endeavour

"Tour A Retired Space Shuttle"

Endeavour is a retired space shuttle housed in the Samuel Oschin Pavilion at California Science Museum. It is a retired orbiter that first flew out in May 1992 and last in May 2011, completing 25 missions while it served as a space shuttle. The exhibit starts with Endeavour Together: Parts & People, where you can observe the artifacts such as its tires, burners as well as the external tank. You are then directed to the main site, where the enthralling space shuttle is displayed. You can go around and underneath it, getting an up-close view of the Endeavour. The images and infographics educate you about the NASA space program and the journey through the city, as a part of its installation at the Samuel Oschin Pavilion. Though you can not enter the shuttle, you can tour the interiors through a live stream on the infotainment. Endeavour has been a crucial part of the American space programs and its presence is a surreal sight to witness. Make sure to reserve or avail physical tickets before they get sold out and you lose your chance to witness this amazing space shuttle.







Ferndell Nature Museum

"A Metropolitan Jungle"

More like its name, Ferndell is not exactly a museum, but a beautiful trail leading to the Griffith Observatory. Once home to the Tongva/Gabrielino tribe, the trail has a natural spring and various planned installations of bridges and railings. Foliage including ferns, create a bubble of clean air and a peaceful environment not away from the city. The natural stream provides the trees and plants with water as it flows through the hill accompanying the trail. Besides the flora, turtles, large koi fish, crayfish, butterflies and dragonflies add to the beauty of the trail. The trail also features waterfalls, ponds and bamboo bridges which were added during



its transformation to create an atmosphere similar to that of a rainforest. The lush green plantation attracts many locals and tourists for an elevated trail rather than simply driving up to the Griffith Observatory. Locals can be spotted taking a jog or hiking up accompanied by their little ones for a fun day out. The collective display of nature and wildlife is equivalent to an interactive museum exhibit that must not be missed.







There are changing exhibitions spotlighting the design and production of glassware, textiles, toys and other crafts. Some of the highlights include the museum's superb collection of Indian masks and Mexican artworks. Started in 1965 by Edith Wyle as a restaurant and crafts shop, it was transformed into a museum in 1973. After suffering financial problems during the early 90s, it moved into its current location in 1995 with backing from the city. Wheelchair access is currently limited to the first floor, but call for information.



Bronson Canyon

"An Old Hollywood Quarry"

Located in Griffith Park, Bronson Caves, also called Bronson Canyon, was created because of an old quarry dug in 1903 by the Union Rock Company in order to mine materials to use in building the surrounding streets. After the quarry closed in the 1920s, it became a spot for movie shoots because of its rocky and unique landscape. Scenes from Invasion of the Body Snatchers and Army of Darkness were shot here, as well as the original Batman TV show. The park has hiking trails, picnic tables and, of course, caves.

"Not A Waste Of Time"



Hollywood Heritage Museum


"Birthplace Of Feature Films"

Schindler House



"Innovative Desert Camp Design"

This unique house-studio was designed by Austrian draftsman Schindler in 1921 and served as his home until his death in 1953. Unlike many of its neighbors, the structure moves away from the art deco style that characterizes much of the early Hollywood structures. Schindler took inspiration from desert camps and built the house out of concrete walls, canvas covers and sleeping lofts. It also served as a meeting place for avant-garde architects, including Richard Neutra, who lived here in the late 1920s. Today the Schindler House is home to the MAK Center for Art and Architecture where visitors can view year-round exhibits and attend events.

"One-of-a-kind Museum"



The Huntington, the former home of a railroad tycoon, is many things—an extensive library filled with rare books, a large art collection containing numerous European prints and paintings, botanical gardens of almost unmatched splendor and a forum for regular lectures and other activities. You will also find a fine bookstore, cafe and tea room on the grounds. Come and wander through the 150 acres of colorful gardens, lily ponds and beautiful sculptures. The rare books and manuscripts in the library include some of the earliest editions of Shakespeare's works, a copy of the Gutenberg Bible on vellum and the Ellesmere manuscript of one or more of Chaucer's greatest works. Please note reservations are required in order to visit and prices vary depending on the day of the week.



The dark wood-paneled interior houses a permanent collection of various bizarre antique contraptions – unusual musical instruments, puzzling utensils, disquieting dolls and sculptures and other wicked hardware. An occasional photo or sculpture exhibition gracing Obsolete is well worth venturing out for (the dates for them can be tracked down on their website). These openings are eagerly anticipated by people in the know and are always held in style, catered by select local artisan eateries and wine sellers.
