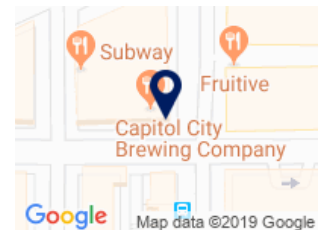

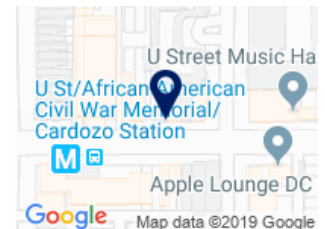

"European Appeal"

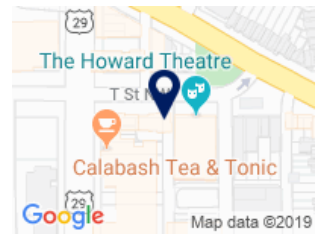
