Bach-Museum Leipzig


"A Museum Honoring Bach"

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St. Thomas Church


"Ancient, Glorious Lutheran Church"

The history of the Thomaskirche is filled with famous names. Martin Luther preached here in the 16th century, J.S. Bach was once choirmaster here and the world-famous Thomanerchor choir can still be heard here every week. Architecturally speaking, the church is distinguished by an unusually steep roof and displays a mixture of Roman, Gothic and more modern styles. The church has been so wonderfully restored that one can never guess its age, as it stands strong throughout many centuries.

Auerbachs Keller


"Goethe's Inspiration"

St. Nicholas Church

"Historically Relevant Church"

Leipzig's oldest and largest church was the epicenter of the peaceful demonstrations which eventually brought the Berlin Wall crashing down in November 1989. But even apart from the events of 1989, the Nikolaikirche (St. Nicholas' Church) still has plenty of historical relevance. Founded in 1175, the church was extended over the years and exhibits a mixture of Romantic, Gothic, Renaissance, Baroque and Classical architectural styles. Bach's Christmas Oratorio was originally performed here and Martin Luther once preached from the pulpit.

"Old is Gold"


Leipzig Botanical Gardens already has a long history, as it has existed since 1542 in the form of a medicinal garden. People come here to look at the amazing amount of plants (all systematically arranged according to their ecological category) to relax, familiarize themselves with new plants or as part of their studies - the Botanical Gardens are part of Leipzig University. Although the grounds aren't huge, it is well worth a visit: as well as free entry, there's the lure of the butterfly house (admission fee applicable).

"Enjoy the Sweeping Views"

The Panometer Leipzig offers a visual treat for nature lovers and students alike as it exhibits the panoramic views of some natural marvel or the other, which changes over time. The famous Berlin artist Yadegar Asisi had recreated the magical forest of Brazilian Amazon in a 108 meter (582.55 feet) long and 30-meter (98.42 feet) high arena. The place gets even more exciting during the evening as the light inside the arena fades to total darkness. With only the sounds to guide you, the experience of the exhibit is elevated to a different level altogether.



Established in 1856 on the insistence of city Lawyer Carl Heine, Karl Heine Kanal is an artificial water body running across the length of the city. The most prominent feature of the canal is that as many as 15 bridges that connect different streets span it. Each bridge has a different name and the canal itself is a major cultural and historical monument in the city and is strictly under preservation.



Leipziger Baumwollspinnerei or the Leipzig cotton spinning mill was the largest in Europe when it opened in 1884. However towards the end of 20 century, the decline in cotton yarn caused its closure. But was reopened considering its historic importance and its simple basic structure which proved to be an inspiration to the artists, today it houses many galleries and studios. Home to art herself, the Leipziger Baumwollspinnerei presents her in various mediums and hence is close to the connoisseurs heart.





Monument to the Battle of the Nations

"Europe's Biggest War Memorial"

One of the greatest war memorials of Europe, the Monument to the Battle of Nations is a magnificent landmark in Leipzig. Opened in the year 1913, it was constructed to commemorate the centennial of the historic Battle of Leipzig. At a height of 91 meters (299 feet), the monument is perched on an artificial hill, facing a spectacular water pool. Made of granite and sandstone, the monumental pyramid is inspired from several architectural styles like Egyptian, Assyrian and Germanic. A figurine of Archangel Michael is placed on the facade, while the interiors contain crypts embellished with statues depicting the soldiers of the war. Offering fantastic panoramas of the environs from the top, the pyramid is a sight to behold as it lights up after dark.


"Sustainable Tourism of Leipzig"

Cospudener See


"Lake & Beach"

Cospudener See is an artificially created lake situated just south of Leipzig. It's especially popular in the summer because of the surrounding sandy beaches and grassy meadows. The track that circles the lake also makes it perfect for cycling and inline skating. On the east side of the lake there is a small marina where you can rent boats, kayaks and even cycle rickshaws. There are several bars and restaurants by the marina as well as a few kiosks dotted along the beach. To get a great view of the entire lake and the surrounding area you can climb to the top of the viewing tower on the south side of the lake.


"Best Lake For Diving"

"Adventure Begins"


One of the most popular slalom tracks of Germany, Kanupark Markkleeberg promises unadulterated fun and adventure in the heart of Markkleeberg. Nestled on the southeastern banks of the river Markkleeberger See, the site of the rafting park originally housed a coal shaft. In 1999, the excess groundwater inundated the lake, thus transforming it into an excellent spot for water sports. Set up in the year 2006, this whitewater rafting track is the only one running on pumps. Kayaking, night rafting, and power rafting pledge an adrenaline rush, while participants are always accompanied by trained professionals. Kanupark Markkleeberg plays host to a number of international and local rafting races. It played venue to the Under-23 and Junior European Championships in the year 2010.






Lake Zwenkau
