

Exposition Park

"Historical Park"

Built for the 1932 Olympic games, Exposition Park is now a venue for many sports and cultural events. Originally known as "Agricultural Park," it houses a sports arena, coliseum, museum, science center, rose garden, a swimming stadium and expo center. The park is bustling with activities throughout the year with events like Annual Bug Fair and Science Camp. The Rose Garden can be hired for special events and the Coliseum hosts popular sports events. Exposition Park also plays host to the L.A. Food Fest, a culinary extravaganza attracting food lovers from far and beyond.

Parque Griffith

"Selva urbana de Los Angeles"

Espalhado por 4.210 acres (1.704 hectares) do extremo leste das montanhas de Santa Monica, o Griffith Park é frequentemente chamado de "o Central Park de Los Angeles". O parque municipal é um dos maiores espaços verdes urbanos da América do Norte. Há amplas oportunidades para atividades ao ar livre, como caminhadas, passeios a cavalo e tênis, além de atrações populares como o Observatório Griffith, o Zoológico de Los Angeles, o Teatro Grego e o icônico letreiro de Hollywood. Na confluência de vegetação paisagística e deserto acidentado, o Griffith Park é o local recreativo mais precioso de Los Angeles e uma fuga cênica.





Huntington Library, Art Collections & Botanical Gardens

"Priceless Sight-Seeing"

The Huntington, the former home of a railroad tycoon, is many things—an extensive library filled with rare books, a large art collection containing numerous European prints and paintings, botanical gardens of almost unmatched splendor and a forum for regular lectures and other activities. You will also find a fine bookstore, cafe and tea room on the grounds.



Come and wander through the 150 acres of colorful gardens, lily ponds and beautiful sculptures. The rare books and manuscripts in the library include some of the earliest editions of Shakespeare's works, a copy of the Gutenberg Bible on vellum and the Ellesmere manuscript of one or more of Chaucer's greatest works. Please note reservations are required in order to visit and prices vary depending on the day of the week.



Greystone Mansion and Park

"Massive House in Beverly Hills"

One of the largest homes ever built in Beverly Hills is the Greystone Mansion, a 55-room English Tudor Mansion constructed by Edward L. Doheny in 1928. A gift to his son, it also includes a huge garden. The grounds have been used as a public park, and the home itself for a variety of purposes, most recently for the activities of the American Film Institute. The interior of the mansion is closed to the public, but the exterior and surrounding park is completely open for visitors.






