Robert Mondavi Winery


"Wine Titan"

Cakebread Cellars


"For The Wine Connoisseurs"

The winery produces 85,000 cases annually and is best known for its classic rich Rutherford Cabernets, Sauvignon Blanc, Pinot Noir and Chardonnay. The entire family is involved with the winery operation, which includes promoting healthy food. The Cakebreads founded the American Harvest Workshop, an annual four-day event that promotes local agriculture and involves chefs, winemakers and farmers. "Coppola's Gem"


Founded as Inglenook in 1880, the historic Rubicon Estate has the honor of being one of the few remaining family-owned wine estates of its magnitude in existence. It is comprised of 235 acres (95 hectares) of organically certified vineyards, and is located in Napa Valley's Rutherford appellation. Rubicon Estate is home to the region's most famous Chateau and Rubicon—the estate's flagship wine. Dominated by a special clone of Cabernet Sauvignon that can be traced back to the original vineyard plantings of 1880, Rubicon is a Bordeaux blend that reflects the unique terrain of this property. In addition to the collection of award-winning wines, Rubicon Estate offers an array of tours and tastings, some historical, others are hands-on and interactive. From guided walks through the vineyard to barrel sample tasting in the cellar, the property's tour guides are experts at creating dynamic wine experiences for all guests. The estate also is home to the Centennial Museum housing memorabilia from Francis Ford Coppola's movies.






Petaluma Wildlife & Natural Science Museum







John Muir National Historic Site

"Famous Naturalist's Preserved Home"

This national park is the preserved home of one of the United States' most famous naturalists and conservationists, John Muir. Muir, who passed away in 1914, founded the Sierra Club and is considered the father of the National Parks system. The site consists of Muir's 17-room Victorian mansion and surrounding fruit ranch, his gravesite, the Martinez Adobe, and the recently added Mount Wanda area that features the John Muir Nature Trail. Take the self-guided tour of the grounds. There are special events around Christmas and on John Muir's birthday, April 21.





The citizens of Santa Rosa have reason to be in a continually celebratory mood as their microbrewery of choice takes top honors nearly every year at Denver's Great American Beer Festival. Since its inception in 1997, it has won such accolades as "Small Brewing Company of the Year," "Innovation in Craft Brewing" and "Large Brewpub Champion Brewmaster." Indeed, gold medal winners include such eloquently named brews as Damnation, Blind Pig and Pliny the Elder. Many of them can be found in pubs throughout the Bay Area, but the headquarters is a must-see destination. Russian River Brewing Company is also credited with inventing the Double India Pale Ale. The entire list of ales is fascinating, each of them unique in blend, texture and flavor. At the tap room, live music entertains crowds as they savor pizzas made thin, crisp and fresh.

Sharpsteen Museum divides its exhibits between the work of Disney animator Ben Sharpsteen, his colleagues, and topics of local historical interest. Particular attention is given to Sam Brannan, California's first millionaire, who gave the town its name. The Sharpsteen Museum's great strength is its focus on making the exhibits invariably interesting and amusing, featuring exhibits and dioramas that depict life in 19th-century Calistoga. Although there is no entry fee to the museum, donations are encouraged.





Old Faithful Geysers of California

"Mesmerizing Hot Water Geysers"

The name "old faithful" is most closely associated with the Yellowstone Park geysers, but it is actually used to describe any geysers that erupt on a regular schedule. Boiling hot water shoots 60 feet (18.3 meters) into the crystal blue sky, while spectators gather casually around and witness this natural spectacle. 

Francis Ford Coppola Winery

"Not Your Average Winery"

The Francis Ford Coppola Winery located in Geyserville just north of Healdsburg is much more than just a winery. While they do, of course have a vineyard and produce their own wine, along with daily tours, the Coppola Winery offers many more services perfect for the whole family, even the kids. The Winery features two swimming pools, connected by a water bridge with jets of water shooting over it, and private cabins and lounge chairs surrounding the pool. Other entertainment options include the winery's bocce ball court and a whole library of games, all of which are free to use. The winery also features a restaurant - RUSTIC, Francis's Favorites and Pool Cafe, a movie museum (it is a Coppola winery, after all) and a "Godfather" inspired pavilion which hosts private events as well as concerts.
